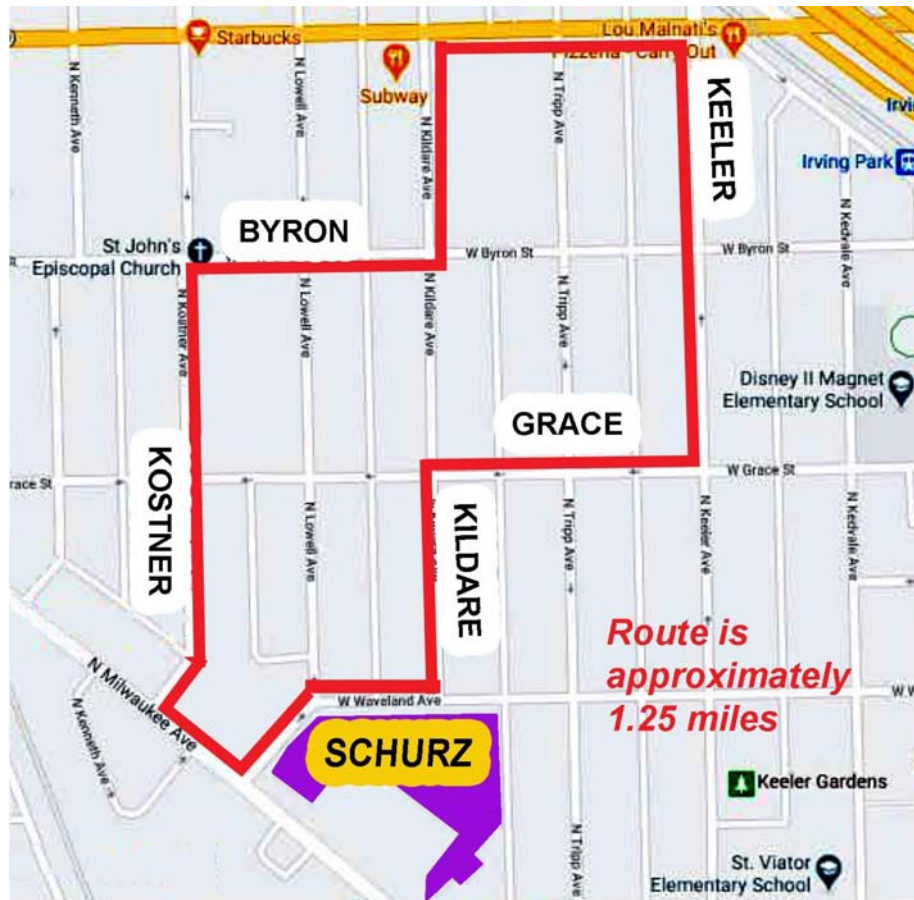




Schurz Schuffle Scavenger Hunt

Use the clues to find Bulldog footprints on 14 rocks hidden along the scavenger hunt route. Write down the letter on the back of each rock, and un-Schuffle the letters at the end to find the special message!

Join us the morning of Saturday, October 24, for two special events along the route (times and locations noted below). Take a picture of your hunt and share it with the #SchurzSchuffle hashtag! **Please practice social distancing while you hunt, and wear masks when you are near people from outside your household.**

CLUES:

- 1) Did you know Schurz has a co-ed 16" softball team? The Bulldogs were 2020 Conference Champs, following an undefeated regular season! That's a lot of celebrations at home base!
- 2) Walk or run around the track. When you find the next Bulldog print, shout GOAL!
- 3) Fans are always welcome to cheer on the Schurz softball and soccer teams from here. For now, find the next Bulldog print, rest your legs, and figure out where to go next. **(On Saturday, Oct. 24, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., meet the Schurz Bulldog and take a socially distant photo!)**
- 4) It's time to set out into the neighborhood. Head down Kostner, where all signs point to the home of one of the Bulldogs' biggest fans.
- 5) Schurz opened in September 1910 to a group of 1,031 students. The next Bulldog print is near the oldest home in Old Irving Park, which predates the school by more than 50 years!
- 6) The flowers may have faded, but this garden is still a peaceful place to pause and look for a Bulldog print and signs of the changing season. Neighbors welcome during daylight hours.
- 7) It's time to pick some books to read while we're spending more time at home this winter. Maybe you'll find something good along with this Bulldog print.
- 8) In summer, many of the neighborhood's intersections are filled with colorful flowers. The blooms may be gone by now, but they still make a good place to hide a Bulldog print!
- 9) This organization has been a beloved part of our community almost as long as Schurz. Y? Because people from all walks of life, and even a few Bears, have come together here to stay healthy. **(Join us here on Saturday, Oct. 24, from 10a.m.-12 p.m., for pumpkin decorating and Halloween festivities.)**
- 10) You'll find the next Bulldog print planted along Irving Park Road, unless the squirrel took it.
- 11) The trees of Old Irving make great places for Bulldog prints to hide as you head back toward the school. Look along Keeler for one nicely nestled in a nook.
- 12) The Schurz Bulldogs "Love Purple, Live Gold!" - and apparently so do the neighbors in the house near where the next print is hidden.
- 13) Don't tripp, it would be a disgrace to miss the next Bulldog print near this eye-catching tree.
- 14) You've followed the Bulldog prints all the way back home. We look forward to gathering inside the school again one day (especially the newly renovated auditorium and library!) - for now look for the final Bulldog print along the back fence.
